FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT (Year B)

17 March '24

Now the Hour has come

In today's Gospel we see some Greeks who are attracted to Israel's God, present in Jerusalem for the celebration of Passover. This event fulfils Jesus words, "I have other sheep, too, that are not in this sheepfold. I must bring them also. They will listen to my voice, and there will be one flock with one shepherd." (Jn. 10/16).

In John's Gospel the word for 'to see' can be used in a metaphorical sense meaning perceiving, discovering, or understanding and so, obviously the Greeks wanted to meet Jesus, talk to him and become his disciples. So, in John's Gospel 'seeing' is 'believing in'.

They sought out Philip because 'Philip' is a Greek name and they realised he would be very familiar with the Greek world.

Because in John's Gospel Philip and Andrew were the first to receive discipleship directly from Jesus, their presence here establishes a connection between the call of the first Jewish disciples, and the first gentile disciples.

As they brought the Greeks to Jesus, Jesus tells them that, 'now my hour has come.' Here the 'hour' is the hour of his death and glorification. Jesus likens his death to sowing a seed into the ground. Just as a seed must die to its life as a single seed before it can yield an abundant harvest, Jesus will bring life in abundance through his death on the cross.

The powerful invitation of the today's Gospel is, "Die before you die, so that when you die, you won't die'.
