Monday Mk.11:12,15,19 April 3, 30AD	Jesus and disciples leave Bethany and return to Jerusalem. They again leave in the evening.	Prayer: The LORD is good to all. His compassion extends over all he has made. (Psalm 145:9)
Tuesday Mark 11:20-27 April 4, 30AD	Jesus & his disciples return to Jerusalem once more.	Prayer: May your mercy, O Lord, be on us, even as we wait confidently for you. (Ps 33:22)

ARRIVAL OF THE MESSAGE STICK

The Message Stick, an ancient and culturally significant instrument of welcome and acceptance, is travelling around the Archdiocese of Brisbane to herald the **150**th **Anniversary of the completion and opening of the Cathedral of St Stephen** on the sacred lands of the First Nations Peoples of Meanjin Brisbane.

Our parish will receive the Message Stick at the Easter Vigil; **the Message Stick holds an invitation** for parishioners across the Archdiocese to come together on Pentecost Sunday, 2024, at the Cathedral to celebrate this momentous occasion of the 150th anniversary. You are encouraged to come and see!

EVERYTHING TO KNOW ABOUT HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is one of the most important weeks in the Catholic Church. Not only is it a part of the Lenten season, but it is also the week where we remember the life and death of Christ. In Holy Week, we celebrate Jesus' love for us, as He died on the cross and resurrected for us to have eternal life.

PALM SUNDAY

To start, Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, which is also the last day of Lent. During Palm Sunday, the Church conducts a blessing of Palms to commemorate the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem.

TRIDUUM

The Triduum consists of three days to pray and remember three essential days in Christ's passion. The Triduum begins on Holy Thursday and ends on the Easter Vigil celebration, which happens on Holy Saturday.

HOLY THURSDAY – 7pm Mass St Mary's Gatton

During Holy Thursday, it is customary that the Catholic Church commemorates the Last Supper. There will be no Masses celebrated again until the Easter Vigil.

GOOD FRIDAY

Good Friday is the day that we commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus. On this day we gather to walk and pray the Stations of the Cross.

On Good Friday, we do not celebrate Mass; however, we observe three things on Good Friday when we gather for the **3pm Passion of the Lord at St Patrick's Laidley**: the Liturgy of the Word, the Veneration of the Cross, and Communion. Do take note that **fasting and abstinence from meat** are required on Good Friday.

HOLY SATURDAY – 6pm Vigil Mass St Mary's Gatton

This day we prepare to celebrate the Easter Vigil at sundown. The Easter Vigil liturgy is the most beautiful liturgy in the Catholic Church. The Vigil is divided into four parts: Service of Light, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Baptism, and Liturgy of the Eucharist. It will be during the Liturgy of Baptism that the RCIA candidates will receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

EASTER SUNDAY – 7am Mass St Therese's Glenore Grove & 9am Mass St Patrick's Easter Sunday is a very important day, and it is the day that Christ rose from the dead, a day that symbolizes our Christian faith. Let us rejoice!
