## **New Heaven and a New Earth**

Whenever we recite the Nicene Creed we express our belief in the resurrection of Jesus. We say, "He suffered death and was buried and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures."

In other words, Jesus is raised to a bodily existence. A different body – a body that can pass through doors, a body that isn't always recognised, a body that bears the marks of the nail and spear wounds, a body that can be touched and felt, a body that eats fish and cooks breakfast by the shore of the lake.

The risen Lord was not a disembodied spirit, but a real body, with whom the disciples could eat and drink.

In the Apostles Creed we recite specifically our faith in the '**resurrection of the body**'. When we recite those words, we are expressing our belief that we, like Jesus, will bodily rise from the dead".

So, what kind of body will we have at the resurrection of the dead? St. Paul uses the image of sowing a seed. The body that dies is like a grain of wheat that is sown. Paul says, what is sown is perishable, **what is raised is imperishable**. What is sown is a physical body, and what is raised is a spiritual body. It is about this St. Paul and the book of Revelation speaks - new heaven and a new earth. (Rev.21:1-5).

People need a story to live by, but the stories we have been telling ourselves in the last several decades have been growing increasingly thin and superficial.

On this feast of Easter, we celebrate the story of Jesus' victory over sin and death. His story makes sense of all other stories – past, present, and future and his story alone **offers life in abundance**.

We die with Christ so that we can rise with him, to live forever in the new creation - the new heaven and the new earth.
