THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Year B) 21 January '24

The Way

This year we read or hear the good news of our Lord from the Gospel of Mark. So, on this weekend and the following weekend, I would like to write about the history, theology, and background of Mark's Gospel for our deeper understanding, assimilation, and the spiritual growth.

Mark is a very sophisticated storyteller. He wrote his gospel between 65 and 75 AD. The Gospel begins with a brief prelude of thirteen verses. Mark does not have an infancy narrative, and we first meet Jesus as an adult.

The second part of the prelude consists of the proclamation of the John the Baptist; **Jesus is baptised** by John in the river Jordan, and then Jesus is driven by the devil to the desert for forty days and there he is tested by Satan.

In the third part we have an account of **Jesus ministry in the Galilee** region and the fourth section is Jesus and disciples' **journey to Jerusalem** for the feast of the Passover.

For this journey the key word Mark uses is 'hodos' that means 'way' which refers to 'the way of discipleship'. Here it is important to understand that the earliest Christians were known as 'Followers of the Way'.

THE MASS ... a series by Archbishop Mark Coleridge

Archbishop Mark Coleridge is a great communicator and commencing in early February, we have the opportunity to unpack the elements of the Catholic Mass in this sixteen-part series that will be shared at Laidley and Gatton churches before the commencement of Mass.

Have you ever wondered about the deeper liturgical meaning of the words we say and actions we may do somewhat habitually?

For example: When there are moments of silence, it isn't because the priest has forgotten the words. So, what is happening in the silence? Everyone is praying in their hearts and in that silence are being drawn into the presence of God.

And then out of the silence the priest gathers up the prayer of everyone in the community.

And then we have the Opening Prayer that traditionally is called the Collect. Why? Because the priest collects the prayers of everyone there into a single voice and a single prayer. As we gain a deeper understanding of each part of the Mass, may it lead each of us into a deeper relationship with our loving God.
