FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Year B) 28 January '24

Costly Freedom

In the first major episode in the public ministry Jesus is confronted by a man with an unclean spirit.

What in the 21st century are we to make of Satan, demons and unclean spirits? "A healthy spirituality will acknowledge the reality of spiritual forces opposed to God and to life. But, to take the gospel material as an invitation to see manifestations of the demonic or the everywhere is dangerous." – Brendon Byrne. In today's Gospel Mark tells us that in the person and actions of Jesus, the **triune God breaks the captivity of the human race** to the demonic, **setting it free** to become truly human.

But, that freedom proclaimed here will not come about without cost: A cost to Jesus, a cost to the Father, and a cost to those to those called to associate themselves with his life and mission.

(Understanding Mark's Gospel – continued from last week) Jesus enters the holy city of Jerusalem on the day that we now celebrate as Palm Sunday. Mark then gives us a day by day account of this last week in the life of Jesus. Over one third of Mark's Gospel is devoted to what Jesus does and savs during last week. (241 out of 664 verses, roughly 36% of the gospel). Another key word that Mark uses during the Galilean and during the way to Jerusalem is 'euthus', which can be translated as 'immediately', or 'instantly'. There is a sense of urgency or immediacy about Jesus' proclamation of the reign of God. This sense of immediacy is enhanced by Mark's use throughout the gospel of what is known as the historical present tense. Instead of talking about events in the past tense. Mark uses the present tense, even though the events he describes took place in the past. Mark describes what Jesus does and says during the last days of his life day by day, even further, hour by hour - morning, mid-morning, noon, mid-afternoon, and evening.

PREPARING FOR LENT

Why not pray that God will bring about the unexpected in your life during your observance of Lent in 2024?

Can this Lent be about **allowing God to do what God wants to do** in your life? Too easily, and perhaps out of habit, we can focus on ourselves as we consider how we will observe Lent. As Shane Dwyer (author of this year's Lent resource) correctly points out, "While making those decisions is appropriate (prayer, fasting and almsgiving are always important), understand that they are your little ways of opening yourself to God's mercy, peace and power. They are like little cracks in the shield of your soul which allow the **light of God** to come flooding in".

LENT RESOURCE NOW AVAILABLE AT ALL CHURCHES - \$ 8

For 17 cents per day, this resource takes you on a 47-day journey into our world as God sees it, and how our individual and parish mission can make a difference. Mark Coleridge, Archbishop of Brisbane, made these comments and encourages you to either use it personally, or to join a group within the parish.

He said, "This resource: A Resurrected Life is subversive. It challenges our conventional way of thinking and invites us to believe in the extraordinary hope that the Gospel bears. This is a hope ground not on vapid promises, but on the fact of a God who takes flesh, entering even our woundedness and brokenness, so that life may come from death and strength from weakness. This is a God who transfigures our wounds, even the cosmic wound of death, which become fountains of healing and life for those around us and for the world".
